Third Sunday of Advent 12th December 2021

We are over the half-way mark and it's Gaudete Sunday when the Church bids us 'REJOICE!' Do you feel you have achieved anything or are you still hoping for a sign, a moment to remind you that you are on track? What about those around you? Are they content, excited, exhausted or down? Advent focuses on God coming to be with us and our drawing nearer to him; this intimate closeness defines all that we do and are.

In our First Reading from Zephaniah, we are asked by the prophet to shout, rejoice and exult with all our hearts. The prophet reminds us at the end of the passage that God is dancing with shouts of joy FOR US! Can you mirror in your life the excitement God has at the prospect of being so close to us? There is much noise and a vibrant picture of love incarnate impatient to be with us! How do we share this with those around us? Ironically it more likely that silence and stillness will arrest those we encounter - the fact that we are willing to give time and create space for this God of ours who is coming.

Zephaniah also says 'The Lord our God is in our midst'. He is on his way and yet at the heart of all we do! How do you experience him? Deep within your heart? In the bustle of a household? In the colour of the lights and decorations already put up? Is the Crib the constant reminder of his presence? Do you see the Saviour in the face of someone you have helped or who has reached out to you? When you have spoken words of forgiveness or asked for pardon, have you had a glimpse of the Son of God who reconciles us to the Father, whose forgiveness we celebrate in Confession? When you are at your lowest and everything is falling apart, are you in the straw of the manger where the Christ Child was laid?

Today rejoice that Christmas is closer. Exult that he has chosen to come near. Recognise the many ways he is in your midst and give joyful thanks for these blessings! God be with you in this third week of Advent. With love and prayers, *Fr. Norbert*

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION On the parish website wgc-catholics.org.uk there are forms for parents to download to enrol children and young people for these Sacraments. First Communion children should be at least in Year 3 at school and Confirmation candidates in at least Year 9. Preparation will begin after the February half-term in 2022 with the Sacraments being celebrated next summer. The enrolment forms will help us to know how many are involved and to plan the respective preparation courses.
