'Go, and do the same yourself.' This is the way today's Gospel passage ends. Jesus faces a lawyer trying to catch him out as he continues on the road to Jerusalem. As always, the Lord turns the tables on him by asking the lawyer a question. The response is excellent but needs clarification as to the identity of a 'neighbour'. The result is the beautifully crafted parable of the Good Samaritan. Religious people, especially priests, don't come out well! It is a stranger who follows a different religion whose heart is open to helping a victim of robbers, who reaches down to pick up the wounded person and who gives of his own money to support the injured one until his own return. So many boundaries are crossed! This is an example which must be copied. The lawyer is asked to live out the same quality of love to his neighbour.

At the end of every Mass, the priest sends the congregation out from the celebration, perhaps with the following words 'Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.' We all leave buoyed up by what we have experienced and challenged to make it a reality in the every day. And that is not always easy. I invite you to reflect on what you have learned and entered into in this weekend's Mass. What is it like to encounter Christ? Who are the people you have worshipped with at the Mass you attended? Do you feel closer to heaven? Do you think heaven is breaking even more into your life? In a mystical way, who are you in communion with? Now let these reflections be mirrored in how you are with others!

We have watched so much happen this week in politics and in our world. Let us pray that God's Spirit may guide, inspire and bless those who struggle to do the right thing. Have a good week yourselves. With love and prayers, *Fr. Norbert*
