## ***24<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the Year 11<sup>th</sup> September 2022***

This time last week I prepared the first newsletter of September. Who would have thought that a week later we would be mourning the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II? Life is strange and no-one can predict all that happens.

In the last days we have had time to reflect on the sense of loss so many of us feel deeply as individuals, as families, as a country and internationally. She has been the only Queen most of us have known; her presence was always assumed to be there. Now it's different. It is as if we have lost a beloved grandparent. Duty and service have been two words used often in these days of mourning to characterise the Queen. Flowers are being laid at the various royal residences and we await the finer details of her Lying in State and her Funeral. If she is brought back to London by train, the railway line through Welwyn Garden will probably be the route taken.

Prayer is our important instinct as we gather as a Christian Community: for the repose of her soul, for her grieving family, for the Nation in a time of transition AND for the new King Charles III. Through prayer we are in conversation with our God, offering needs and petitions and hearing the message of hope and eternal life. Prayer is the communion of hearts united and raising a word of thanksgiving for so many blessings as well as asking for help. In our Gospel passage this weekend we are presented with the picture of the overwhelming, unconditional love of God revealed in the three parables of Jesus about the finding of what was lost. Sheer delight, joy and celebration ensue!

At this stage, let us take stock and ponder the events which are unfolding and which will certainly be part of our country's history. Let us pray hard, feeling the gentle caress of God's loving arms surrounding us with comfort and tenderness. Let us not be afraid to speak of our hope of Resurrection evidenced in God's own Son who suffered, died and rose again.

May Queen Elizabeth rest in peace. God save the King!

On 28th September the more detailed report will be available for discussion and result in a final draft to be sent to the Cardinal. Each one of you is so important in this consultation process. We need MANY of you to come to the meeting!

**SUPPLY PRIEST** Monsignor Harry Turner is helping us with a couple more Sundays and a weekday. It is good to have his support.

**CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLICTY** Some of our Catholic Schools require the Parish Priest to provide a Certificate of Catholicity for entry to Primary or Secondary School. In due course Fr. Norbert will publish how this will be done. However, he wants to emphasise that attendance at Mass is a requirement. Covid has placed many burdens on individuals, families and households; now is the time to do your best to return regularly to church. Children can only get here if they are brought by their families. Thank you.

**SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION** for First Confession, First Holy Communion and Confirmation will start after Christmas. Soon we will ask parents to enrol their children for Communion and young people to enrol for Confirmation. We will let you know when the application Forms are on the website. Also, if any adults would like to be catechists for these Sacraments, please let Fr. Norbert know. There would be training and all the necessary safeguarding guidelines would have to be followed.

**RCIA** The Rite of the Christian Initiation of Adults for adults who would like to join the Catholic Church will start on Monday 7th November at 7.30pm in the Sacristy of Our Lady's. There are a number who have made themselves known. If you are interested please speak to Fr. Norbert. This is also a great way for adults, who missed out on Confirmation when they were younger, to prepare for Confirmation. In some countries you cannot get married in the Catholic Church if not confirmed.
