***23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time 5<sup>th</sup> September 2021***

Today's Gospel reading from St. Mark is wonderful! There is a big gathering with the crowd bringing a deaf man with a speech impediment to Jesus to lay his hand upon him. We see Jesus take the man aside in private and speak to him setting him free from what he has experienced and enriching his life with hearing and clear speech. We return to the response of the multitude who are over the moon and praise Jesus for all the good things he has done.

How has your week gone? Were there highpoints enjoyed with others? Were there quiet, reflective moments when you just knew God was there? As we prepare to enter a fresh week, what are you grateful to God for? For me it has certainly been a schools' week! Leading reflections with staff on their inset days, celebrating Mass with a Year 7 cohort and a service with Year 12 put me in touch with adults, young people and children at a key point in their lives - what a blessing! I also had a Wedding last Saturday and then a Baptism on Sunday with the joy of families and friends gathering in their respective ways. Going back to the man in the Gospel, he now could hear the voice of Jesus - what do you think it sounded like in tone, strength and expression? The man can speak clearly - what message does he have to communicate to those around him and how is it uttered? We meet Jesus in so many ways. Let us be ready to hear him even more attentively and to use our whole being to share with others the joy of knowing him.

## **HERTS WELCOMES REFUGEES**

Here is an update from Herts Welcomes Refugees (HWR) in the light of the unfolding crisis in Afghanistan:

You will all be concerned about the horrific situation in Afghanistan so here is an update on related activities in Hertfordshire.

There are already 24 Afghan families (130 individuals) in two hotels in the Watford area. They came here under the Afghan Relocations and Assistance Policy (ARAP Scheme) and have been given emergency, short term support from the Red Cross and assistance from the Home Office.

HWR, mainly via Kate Scott, our very active Area Convenor for Dacorum, and several other charities are taking, or have already delivered, clothing, children's toys and books and other urgently needed items.

**At the moment we do not need any more of these - but we will let you know if we are asked for more.**

**What we do need are mobile phones - wiped - and/or Sim cards with £10 or £20 on them.**

If you are able to provide any of these they can be posted to Kate at 80 Oak Cross Road, Berkhamsted, HP4 3HZ.

We realise that phones would be more expensive to post and if you prefer these could be dropped off at my house - 106 Handside Lane, WGC, AL8 6SY. (If the package won't fit through the letter box and there is no reply please go round the back of the house and leave on one of the cushioned chairs under the porch.

According to the Watford Observer Welwyn Hatfield is one of three Hertfordshire boroughs to have committed to taking in Afghan refugee families under the ARAP scheme.

**Can you email your local councillors to say how glad you are about this? Apparently Grant Shapps has said he is looking forward to welcoming Afghans to the area so we should email him as well.**

The HWR Management Team are discussing the impact the new arrivals will have on us and how we can help the local authorities who take in Afghan refugees. Obviously there will be more work to do but we will continue to support the refugees and asylum seekers who are already here and still need our help.
