

## Baptism of the Lord/2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of the Year 8<sup>th</sup> January

This weekend (8th/9th January) the Church takes to the banks of the River Jordan, to a scene which highlights the identity of Jesus Christ who is God's Son and upon whom the Father's favour rests. This is St. Matthew's account of the Baptism of the Lord. Next weekend the text comes from St. John's Gospel and we hear John the Baptist declaring that he saw the Spirit come down and rest on Jesus like a dove. The Baptist confirms that he has seen and that he is a witness that Jesus is the Chosen One of God. The Evangelists give us different perspectives and it is so important to stop and reflect on what is being revealed and the insights being shared with us.

In this period immediately after Christmas, what can you remember seeing during the celebrations? How has Jesus made himself known to you personally? Was there a moment or a place? Did the unexpected occur? Was there a person who made an impact? Did you find yourself speaking or acting in such a way that you pointed someone to Christ, perhaps unconsciously? John the Baptist in St. John's Gospel is the constant signpost letting people know of the Lord's presence. St. Matthew has a fondness for the names of God's Son, namely Jesus which means the One who saves and Emmanuel - God with us. St. Matthew wants us to find God in our midst through Jesus, the One who brings forgiveness. Which of these appeals to you the more?

Over the years I have found that these weeks can be very trying for many people as Christmas fades into the distant past and Easter is months away. This is the season when the multitude starts to feel exhausted and overwhelmed. How can we help one another? What difference can we make? I hope that the event on Tuesday7th February at Westminster Cathedral will give everyone something to look forward to if able to get to London. For others the Mass and celebration on Saturday 11th February at 6pm will give us as a community an opportunity to get together and party well!

May 2023 bring you many blessings. Through you may others be blessed by God. May our community flourish!

PEACE SUNDAY 15th January. The Bishops of England and Wales invite us to make this a day of prayer for peace and to reflect on the theme chosen by Pope Francis, which this year is "No one can be saved alone. Combatting Covid-19 together, embarking together on paths of peace." The Pope says: Covid-19 plunged us into a dark night. It destabilized our daily lives, upset our plans and routines, and disrupted the apparent tranquillity of even the most affluent societies. It generated disorientation and suffering and caused the death of great numbers of our brothers and sisters. In addition to its physical aspects, Covid-19 led to a general malaise in many individuals and families; the long periods of isolation and the various restrictions on freedom contributed to this malaise, with significant long-term effects. Pope Francis continues: What then is being asked of us? First of all, to let our hearts be changed by our experience of the crisis, to let God, at this time in history, transform our customary criteria for viewing the world around us. We can no longer think exclusively of carving out space for our personal or national interests; instead, we must think in terms of the common good, recognising that we belong to a greater community, and opening our minds and hearts to universal human fraternity. We cannot continue to focus simply on preserving ourselves; rather, the time has come for all of us to endeavour to heal our society and our planet, to lay the foundations for a more just and peaceful world, and to commit ourselves seriously to pursuing a good that is truly common.
