
WELWYN GARDEN CITY



Today is Vocations Sunday when we are asked to prize our personal calling from God and to pray for more vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. All vocations are important and are significant in the life of the Church; all vocations enrich our world. However, I am sure that Priesthood and Religious Life are often not considered as serious ways of life by many people.

On the radio earlier in the week, I heard that this year there are 45 women who have put themselves forward for the Religious Life in this country, wanting to serve as sisters and nuns. Apparently this is the largest number for 25 years. The reporter got very excited and was trying to analyse why this had taken place. What do YOU think? What would attract women to the Religious Life? What is it about Priesthood which would inspire a young man to offer his life as a priest? In some dioceses in the world, parishioners are asked to pray very hard that one or two of their number should answer the call especially to the Priesthood. They identify young men, encourage them, pray for them and support them. I have heard that there are places which produce a huge harvest of priestly vocations year by year! Is that what we want? How can we make a difference? Who would you personally approach and ask to consider becoming a priest?

On Monday 18th May there is going to be a Vocations Event at St. Bonaventure's at 7pm. Although it is a Diocesan Event, it is taking place in our midst. Firstly, let us set ourselves to pray hard that young men will come, that they will have the courage to take a first step and find out more by meeting others of a similar mind, by listening to those already priests and by joining together in contemplating in prayer what God is asking of them. Secondly, reflect on who you know who might have the seeds of a priestly vocation in them: someone in your family or who you see at church? What about yourself, is it something you have thought about for a long time and just put off doing anything about? Jesus Christ is our Good Shepherd. May there be many more to work with him in

WALSINGHAM PILGRIMAGE on Saturday 16th May. A coach has been booked. You need to be at Our Lady's for 7.45am and we will leave Walsingham at 5pm. We will be joining the National Pilgrimage of the Deaf. The day will include the Rosary, Walk along the Holy Mile and Mass. Hopefully the weather will be good for a picnic lunch. Walsingham in Norfolk has been a place of holiness, mystery and atmosphere for almost a thousand years since Richeldis de Faverches was inspired by Our Lady to build a Shrine in perpetual memorial of the Annunciation. One of the greatest Shrines in Medieval Christendom – when travel to the Holy Land was virtually impossible – the original Shrine was destroyed at the Reformation. Many barren years passed until the Slipper Chapel, a 14th century wayside pilgrim chapel, was restored and pilgrimage to Walsingham began once more. In 1934, the English Bishops named the Slipper Chapel, the Roman Catholic National Shrine of Our Lady. If you would like to join us on the coach, please sign your name on one of the sheets at the back of our churches. Cost: £10 for adults and £5 for children payable in advance or on the coach.
