The Good Samaritan is surely a parable each one of us knows so well? You could probably tell the story with your Bible shut and your eyes closed! *That is the problem*. 'Why?' I hear you asking yourself. Well, we can become so familiar with Scripture that it stops having an impact on our lives. We can feel we know the answer even before stopping to reflect. Perhaps you might even think there is no need for a homily today because we all know what Jesus expects! That's the danger and it is this very trap that the parable challenges us not to fall into.

The priest and the Levite were religious people and probably very good; they were doing the things that were supposed to be done and their focus was totally on their duties, I would imagine. The Samaritan came from a race despised by the Jewish nation and Samaritans would have held the same opinion of the Jews. So, why did the Samaritan stop? Why did he take time to help the person in distress? And why did he spend so much of his own money on a stranger? The parable is so thought-provoking and it roots us in the reality of our lives and the people we encounter - our attitudes and our actions. As religious people, are our eyes open to the person in need? Are our hearts ready to reach out? Would we - and do we - put ourselves out for the stranger?

At the end of the passage, Jesus says: 'Go and do the same yourself.' Remember Jesus has set his face towards Jerusalem; he is on the way to the Cross. Jesus wants everyone to be saved and his journey will show us the way. At this point he is saying to YOU and to ME: 'Action is required by you NOW!' What a challenge from the Son of God! Please take time to reflect on the Lord's parable. And let each one us make the Good Samaritan's actions OUR actions as well! God bless you. *Fr. Norbert*

LAMPEDUSA CROSS is made from pieces of a boat that was wrecked on 11th October, 2013 off the coast of Lampedusa. 311 Eritrean and Somali refugees were drowned en route from Libya to Europe. Inhabitants of Lampedusa helped to save the lives of 155 others. After meeting some of the survivors who are Eritrean Christians in the church on Lampedusa, Mr Tuccio, the island's carpenter, was moved by their plight but felt frustrated that he could not make a difference to their situation. The best he could do was to use his skills as a carpenter to fashion each of them a cross from the wreckage of the boat as a reflection on their salvation from the sea and hope for the future. The Cross will be with us for at least two weeks and will be in each of our churches at some point for Mass. CAFOD has produced a card on which people can write a message to refugees or migrants offering hope and encouragement in all they face. Please fill out one if you feel able and these will be sent to CAFOD. Thank you.
