

In two weeks time, Pope Francis will seal the Holy Doors of St. Peter's as the Year of Mercy draws to a close. When will they be opened again? I suppose an obvious year would be 2033 when we will mark 2000 years since the Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Perhaps a future Pope might find a reason to have a Jubilee Year before then and so the Doors will be unsealed and flung open? A Jubilee Year is a time of grace and blessing - an opportunity to be seized of coming closer to God and being open to his love in a fresh way and offering that gift to others.

Here in Welwyn Garden City we have had the Deanery Doors of Mercy at Our Lady's and many have come from afar as well as from our own three parishes to reflect on God's mercy and the challenge of bearing the fruits in our lives of the corporal works of mercy (to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, heal the sick, visit the imprisoned, bury the dead) and the spiritual works of mercy (to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offences, bear patiently those who do us ill and pray for the living and the dead). Soon we will have a Mass of Thanksgiving marking the closing of the Jubilee Year on Friday 18th November. As one priest of the Deanery reminded us - and insisted - mercy does not come to an end...and he is right! God's mercy will continue to be lavished upon us and so many others. This Year of Mercy has heightened our awareness and opened us up to new perspectives and different experiences.

We are now in November, a month when we take time to remember those who have died and commend them to God. God is a God of mercy who wants all people to share in his gift of eternal life. Jesus' Death and Resurrection are the source of everlasting peace and rest. Let each of us pray with all our heart, mind and soul for the Holy Souls that they be perfected by God's grace and come to the eternal vision of Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

CHRISTIANS AGAINST POVERTY UPDATE For 4 years there has been a Christians Against Poverty Debt Centre in WGC. This has been run in partnership with Panshanger Church and with the support of other WGC churches. The Team has met 93 clients and prayed with 92 of them, in their own homes. 28 households have gone debt-free. 21 are continuing to work with CAP to become debt-free. 3 are managing with minimal input. Each client generally requires three official meetings with the debt centre manager and volunteer. Clients' issues are often far more complex than 'simply' one of debt, and this calls for a holistic, and very prayerful, approach to ministry. There is now the thought of extending this Ministry, and applications are being sought from people in the Welwyn Hatfield area for the role of CAP Debt Centre Manager. The Manager is responsible for ensuring that the Centre achieves its purpose of reaching local people in need of CAP's debt counselling service, and giving clients the opportunity to hear and respond to the love of Jesus. This is an exciting ministry opportunity, starting early 2017, for someone committed to serve the local community, to promote the Christian faith in line with the objectives of Christians Against Poverty, and to demonstrate the Love of God in a very practical way to the people of Welwyn Hatfield, especially those who are struggling.
