

Today I complete ten years in Welwyn Garden City! It is the longest appointment I have had and it is such a privilege to be here as your Parish Priest, serving you and many others in the area. When I was asked to come to the Garden City, Bishop George Stack said there was no blueprint and that I would have to find a model of operating that would realise the vision of one Catholic Community with three churches. We are still here and the process continues! Sadly over these years many have died. Their loving service and generosity have built strong foundations for the future. So many sacrifices have been made in ensuring the vibrancy of the Catholic Church here: the financial giving, the offer of time and support, the attempt to think in new ways, the power of prayer underpinning everything. There have been a huge number of happy times and experiences, with laughter and the unexpected taking place. What I love is journeying with people and sharing their lives, discovering in myself new skills to meet the fresh challenges which crop up. I can't do it on my own and I am grateful to the priests and parishioners who have offered help and encouragement. A new phase has begun with people moving into the newly built properties and enriching the life of the Church.

The Scriptures offered today are interesting and thought-provoking. We have to think outside of the box, namely letting God be God. In the First Reading from Numbers, two men remain in the camp and are found to be prophesying. Joshua wants to put a stop to this but has to be put in his place by Moses who recognises that the Lord has given his Spirit to them. In the Gospel passage from St. Mark, Jesus says quite clearly to his disciple John: 'Anyone who is not against us is for us.' Christ continues by saying that his disciples should not let anyone or anything come between them and God. St. James is so harsh with his community in the Second Reading and does not mince his words about the rich who forget the poor and downtrodden. So we cannot be complacent. THIS IS GOD'S WORK! There is much to do so that the Gospel can be proclaimed more firmly and the Kingdom become a reality. Let all us aspire to work together and draw many more to Christ! Thank you. God bless you. CAFOD FAST DAY This Friday is a Cafod Fast Day when we are asked to have a simple meal and save money to help the poorest and most vulnerable people in our world. We are reminded by Cafod that eating a simple meal isn't always easy but that it puts us in solidarity with our brothers and sisters who cannot make the choice themselves. Examples of how the money will be spent are as follows: £7 provides a spade and a pick axe to help a community maintain their borehole to get fresh water; £28 buys a goat giving a family milk to drink and sell; £98 trains ten families how to grow vegetables. There are special envelopes to GiftAid your contribution. As always THANK YOU for your generosity.

**SECONDARY SCHOOL TRANSFER** Fr. Norbert urges parent/s to visit Secondary Schools with their child and to reflect on which school will help their child flourish. For those applying to Catholic Schools a Certificate of Catholicity is required which affirms that a child comes from a practising Catholic family, i.e. a family which attends Mass every week. It is crucial to read a school's admissions policy to see if your child has a good chance of getting in. Fr. Norbert will be available in October to sign the Certificate of Catholicity Forms: **Wednesday 10th 4.00 - 6.00pm**, **Monday 15th 4.00 - 6.30pm** and **Tuesday 23rd 4.00 - 6.30pm**. Please make an appointment with Kathryn Hubbard for a 10-minute slot. Parent/s and child should come to Our Lady's Church and wait to be called. In due course there will be the 'extra' form at the back of our churches which will need to be filled and brought to the meeting.

**RCIA** This Monday we start the RCIA, the process by which adults get to know more about the Catholic Church and then make a decision about joining the Church through Baptism (or Reception), Confirmation and First Holy Communion. Also, Catholic adults, who missed out on Confirmation when younger, can prepare for this Sacrament. It is a great journey as the group gets to know Christ better and deepens its appreciation of faith. Come to the first session on Monday 1st October at 7.30pm in Our Lady's Sacristy. *No strings attached!!* 

**CONFIRMATION** Enrolment of young people for Confirmation will be in Holy Family Church on Sunday 21st October at 7pm. Young people should be at least in Year 9 at school. Parents are asked to come to this meeting with their son or daughter. The meeting will last one hour.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION Enrolment for St. Bonaventure's First Confession and First Holy Communion will be in the Parish Hall of St. Bonaventure's on Saturday 13th October at 11am. The children's sessions are once a month on a Saturday and will begin the following Saturday (20th October). Enrolment for Our Lady's Church will be on Tuesday 27th November at 7.45pm in Our Lady's Church (children do not have to attend); the sessions are on a Sunday morning starting in the new year. Enrolment for Holy Family Church will be on Sunday 2nd December after 9.30 Mass. Holy Family's sessions begin in the new year and are usually after school midweek. HCPT 2019 Group 183 desperately needs helpers for Easter Week (Monday 22nd - Saturday 27th April) to ensure that the children and young people who wish to go can do so. Helpers have to attend training and safeguarding before the trip, as well as have time getting to know their child before travel. They will also have to be able to pay for their own fare.
