Thirty-second Sunday of the Year 10th November page 161 of Mass Book

Do you remember many months ago when, in St. Luke's Gospel, Jesus set his face towards Jerusalem and embarked on a significant journey? We have travelled with him, observing his compassion, listening to parables of mercy, challenged by his hard-hitting words. Disciples have been following, sent out and returning; curious people have tagged on; opponents have made life difficult for him. NOW we are in Jerusalem; today's passage unfolds within the city. Let us recall the power of what took place in this city: Jesus carried his cross. He died forgiving those putting him to death. The glory of Resurrection shone out on Easter Day.

It is important to keep all of this in mind today on Remembrance Day in the month of November. Outside it is dark and gloomy. Nature is slowly drawing its cycle to a close as autumn will succumb to winter. We are praying for those who died in the Two World Wars and subsequent conflicts. It would be easy to leave things at that. And yet, just as on Easter Sunday, so now, the light and hope of the Lord's victory erupt from where there appeared to be total desolation and finality. As we remember the dead and their sacrifice for our freedom, we gratefully and lovingly commend them to God that they in their turn might share in Jesus' Resurrection. As we pray for those whose lives are at risk in the present age in order to safeguard peace and justice, we live in the hope that God's Kingdom will come and that his goodness may triumph.

In our Gospel passage there the Sadducees are keen to catch Jesus out about Resurrection. Imagine, so close to Jesus' sacrifice on the Cross, his protagonists are putting him on the spot! Jesus is convinced that God is the God of the living, that to God, all people are alive. Jesus knows his Father wants all to be saved and that is why he willingly will pour out his life for the salvation of the human race. It is our great and noble tradition, not only to remember the dead in this month of November, but also to pray for them, that God's purifying grace may make up whatever was lacking, whatever still needs release. Our prayers - in the name of Jesus - can make a difference!
