

Second Sunday of Lent 8th March page 155 of Mass book

Always on the Second Sunday of Lent, the Church invites us to go up a high mountain with Jesus and his three close disciples in order to share the experience of the Transfiguration. We are given a glimpse of Jesus' future glory and an understanding of the Father's deep love for his Son. There are three snippets of Scripture I would like to focus on today.

Peter says to Jesus in today's Gospel reading from St. Matthew: 'Lord, it is wonderful for us to be here...' Have you ever found yourself uttering similar words - something amazing unfolding and you want it to last for ever? Perhaps by offering to make three tents, Peter's desire is to hold onto the Transfiguration for ever? However, the Father's voice takes centre stage! They still have more journeying which will entail going down the mountain and trekking over more terrain which will eventually result in Jesus climbing Calvary. The memory of a great event is important and can buoy us up when times are darker. Don't forget wonderful experiences!

God the Father declares: 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' I can't help but think back to the Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan. There the Spirit comes upon the Lord and the Father's voice resounds with affirmation for his Son. The extra words in this passage are 'Listen to him.' So we are called upon not only to behold the wondrous vision and discern who Christ is, but also to listen to his words and let them inspire us. Lent is a powerful period for us to reflect on the gift of Baptism which we have received while there are some in our community preparing for their own Baptism at Easter. Baptism creates in us a concrete relationship with Jesus, giving us a better sense of belonging to Christ and to his pilgrim people. We are opened up to listen and really hear. How wonderful!

At the end of the passage, Jesus gives the disciples the following order: 'Tell no-one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.' Lent takes us to Easter, to a new life which breaks into our world and summons us to a taste of eternity. Only with the Resurrection do the disciples fully understand what happened to Jesus on that mountain. What a revelation! Every Lent as we leave the mountain of Transfiguration and continue walking with Jesus for a few more weeks, the Lord transforms us too by the intimate love of the Cross with suffering and the forgiveness of sins, preparing us for his triumphant Victory - eternal life in his presence. That is why the Church gives us this passage on the Second Sunday of Lent! May God be with us in all the challenges we face at this time.

LENT During Lent there will be **Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament** for half an hour on a Monday after 9.30 Mass at Our Lady's (except 9th March), on a Thursday after 9.30 Mass at Holy Family and on a Saturday after 10am Mass at St. Bonaventure's. There will be **Stations of the Cross** on a Wednesday after 9.30 Mass at Holy Family, on a Friday after 9.30 Mass at St. Bonaventure's and on a Friday after 7pm Mass at Our Lady's (except 13th March). The **Sacrament of Reconciliation** (**Confession**) will be available on Thursdays at Holy Family Church 10.00 - 10.30am and on Saturdays - at St. Bonaventure's 10.30 - 11.00am and at Our Lady's 5.00 - 5.30pm. There will be priests also available at Our Lady's on Friday 20th March after Stations of the Cross and the Holy Week Service on Tuesday 7th April at 8pm at Our Lady's. Don't forget the First **Friday early morning Mass** at St. Bonaventure's at 6.30 followed by breakfast (3rd April).

BIBLE STUDY UPDATE: Fr Tony writes: 'On Thursday this week we held the fourth session of our bible study programme. This session covered the period of Israel's slavery in Egypt, the Exodus, and Israel's 40-year wandering in the desert. During this period, God gave Moses the Ten Commandments to replace the 'false Gods' Israel had followed in Egypt. Saint Pope John Paul II called the Ten Commandments '...the law of freedom: not the freedom to follow our blind passions, but the freedom to love, to choose what is good in every situation, even when to do so is a burden'. This week we might consider the question: what kind of 'false Gods' do the Ten Commandments free us from?

There will be refreshments at the back of the church to round off the evening. The event has been promoted by Westminster Youth Ministry through its 'Summit' outreach programme and there will be some input from the WYM as well as from the group usually leading. There will still be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Scripture, prayer, music and silence ending with Benediction.

Or try the repair drop-ins in Hitchin to fix your item rather than throw it away. 4) Eat seasonally and locally. Eating within the seasonal rhythm of nature gives us better tasting food and cuts our carbon foot-print. 5) Go single use plastic-free. Buy a reusable coffee cup and water bottle to refill as you go and reduce the harmful plastic that ends up in our oceans.'
