Fourth Sunday of Easter 3rd May 2020

Today the Church invites us to think about Jesus our Good Shepherd who knows and cares for his flock. We rejoice that God has given us a calling and has a purpose for each one of us in life. The passage of St. John's Gospel proclaimed at Mass has Jesus saying specifically that he is the 'Gate' of the sheepfold; he is the way of entry and exit, offering life in all its fullness. Perhaps you might take time today to reflect on what it means for you to belong to Jesus Christ as a member of his flock? The fact he knows you by name and that he wants you to recognise his voice - what difference does that make to who you are and how you respond to him? Do you believe that he gives you freedom, trusting you to accept his offer of eternal life? Where is he in the midst of the crisis we are living through?

Last Sunday night I had a call from someone I first met nearly thirty years ago. He had trained as a nurse, marrying another nurse and we had kept in touch. He told me that he had the coronavirus and that it was likely to take a turn for the worse and he could not predict how things would turn out. I really had to listen! Finding words of hope and comfort, offering the riches of our faith, feeling sadness that this former parishioner-turned-friend was at a crunch moment in life, praying with him on the phone...these were aspects of priesthood which I never would have expected when I started out nearly 32 years ago. On Thursday I received a message to say he had started to improve - what a relief!

I have always had the conviction of God's calling to me and the enormity of what he demands. But it is only in the reality of what life brings that I have truly learned what it means to be the Lord's priest and to be at the service of my people.

When I was involved in a major car accident in Tanzania back in 1994, I had to spend 6 months convalescing. I had come so close to death and yet lived to tell the tell, aware that the Lord had more in store for me! Now with lockdown and unable to minister in a public way, again I have been called back to the roots of the vocation I responded to when still a boy. As I celebrate Mass in an empty church, I try to picture all of you from the three churches in your favourite seats, superimposed on the empty benches of Our Lady's. We have shared so much over the years and now God give us an even greater challenge to be true to our calling as a Catholic Christian community unable to gather and yet aware of, and in close communion with, each other and the Lord.

We rightly give thanks to God for the sacrifice and care of frontline workers whose dedication is beyond compare. And yet each of you has your own 'frontline' - people, circumstances and places where you are called to give of yourself and make a difference. It might appear small and insignificant at times but remember how this loving care harnessed is transforming. Our vocations lived out to the glory of God and served to the best of our abilities reveal that we belong and that we are destined for the fullness of life in heaven of which God gives us a taste here on earth.

With Fr. Tony, I ask God to bless you and strengthen you with wisdom, energy and determination. Have a good week and stay safe. *Fr. Norbert*
