# Second Sunday of Advent 6th December 2020

John the Baptist is here! He always makes his appearance in Advent. We hear a voice with its clear message. We see him in his exotic clothing and eating choice desert food. Most importantly, God uses this instrument to stir our hearts into action responding to the urgent call to repentance. Indeed John's first words which we hear in St. Mark's Gospel are 'Someone is following me...' It's is very easy to focus attention on the strange, unusual personality; however, John is so keen to carry out his purpose of preparing the way for the Lord. The power of John's insight lies in the fact that the Coming One will baptise with the Holy Spirit. What do you personally make of John? Does he figure in your reflection? Do you consign him to history leaving him as someone from the past?

Repentance implies admitting I haven't always got it right. It is the introduction of a new pointer offering fresh direction. The Greek 'metanoia' is a change of heart and a reorientation of perspective. Repentance opens us up to forgiveness which is a gift experienced from God which then must be used to give someone else the same quality of encounter. 'Reconciliation' is a word we now use often in the Church and for me it implies healing and peace as relationships are mended with God, with others and with oneself in the core of one's being. This year as we continue our Advent journey, it will not be as easy to seal this dynamic of repentance - forgiveness - reconciliation sacramentally as we might have done in the past. It is not as straightforward getting to Confession; the COVID-19 requirements are strict and so many things weigh upon us making us anxious and fearful. Nevertheless God has not abandoned us. God reaches out with a hand of loving kindness; God ceaselessly is finding ways of breaking into our lives with mercy and compassion. Have you found this? Think about this week. Has someone reached out to you when you least expected it?

Did another person make you feel good when you were feeling low and kindle joy within you? Was patience shown you or did you hear a forgiving word? Have you found yourself being a source of gracious healing in a setting you least thought likely? God is at work. God works in mysterious ways. God uses these moments to break into the lives of others through us. In better times when opportunities come for Sacramental Confession, that will be the moment to express in word what your heart tells you has happened and hear concretely the Prayer of Absolution; in the present, never stop acknowledging that you are in need of his healing grace and be open to it as God chooses to share it with you.

Finally, our world desperately needs more John the Baptists! Individuals, couples, families, households and communities ready to stand up and be counted, determined to point to Christ's presence with all that he brings. As with John, it will be easy to be misinterpreted with resultant scorn and suffering. God wants us in small and massive ways to make a difference in this Season of Advent so that no one misses out on hearing Good News and being transformed by the message. Perhaps this could be a challenge you ponder this week in the midst of our post-lockdown world (in Tier 2!)?

Fr. Tony and I continue to pray for you. We value your faith and your prayers, your determination and dedication. God bless you and all your loved ones. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*

**METANOIA Jesus conquers evil** On Thursday this week we had the eighth session in our online course, 'Metanoia'. The theme this week was Jesus' power over evil. *Summary:* Although we do not need to be obsessed with the evil one, we need to be aware that he exists. However, Jesus confronts the evil one and has authority over him. Jesus has given us a share in his power over the evil one. Every time we resist temptation and respond to grace, we participate in Christ's saving victory over evil. This response to grace is conversion, which is God acting in us.

Reflection: Come, Holy Spirit. Take a moment to pray a prayer of gratitude thanking Jesus for his victory over evil and for the ways you have experienced this victory in your own life. When you are done, ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen your hope and fortitude for the struggles you may face as you draw closer to God.

**CAFOD** *Tony Sheen from CAFOD Westminster has written:* Heartfelt thanks for all that you and your parish have done to support CAFOD during this difficult year. I am writing with a short CAFOD update and information about our Advent resources for parishes.

Although the needs are huge the generosity of the Catholic community in England and Wales has enabled CAFOD to continue our work this year. Together we have supported some of the world's poorest communities most impacted by the virus, reaching people in more than 33 countries. These include Yemen, Syria, Sudan, Democratic Republic of Congo and Brazil where communities were already facing tough challenges. Over six million people received health advice, and more than half a million people received hygiene supplies and services to prevent and reduce infection. Many more poor and vulnerable families have been supported with food supplies when they had no way to earn a living during lockdown.

To pass our thanks on to your parishioners. Kayode Akintola, who works for CAFOD in Sierra Leone, West Africa, recorded a message of thanks for all of our supporters, for sharing via social media, websites and newsletters.
