OUR LADY,

Today's Gospel passage is from St. John; in it we see the first disciples gathering around Jesus. The Baptist points to Jesus who passes by and says 'There is the Lamb of God'. Two latch onto Jesus and spend the day with him. It is a beautiful scene evoking the magnetism of Jesus and I have often pondered what those new disciples would have witnessed in the course of the day. One year at this time, I was on holiday in Goa, where my family comes from, and as I reflected on this passage I walked along the sea, soaking in the sunshine and feeling the sand between my toes. I thought of the people they would have met, of how Jesus would have looked at them and responded, of how this would have had a huge impact on the new disciples. Such holidays are now but a dream! The Gospel image is NOT!

In these last few days, we have had icy winds and so much rain battering us and keeping us indoors. On Thursday I went out for a long walk, jumping over puddles, gloves keeping me warm and looking out for people who might be coming towards me. It was so interesting! One man was out walking his dog and moved off the path into the mire. Cheerfully he said to me 'I'm muddy already!' A lady pointed to her walking boots as she stepped out of the way. I must add that I am very happy to wait and let people pass. One couple much older than me smiled as I let them go by and said to me: 'There's a room in heaven for you'. I had been walking for around 30 minutes and the next hour left me uplifted by their words, their joy and the difference it made to me. I kept thinking about the two disciples with Jesus and how his ministry was preparing people for a place in heaven, that even here on earth we have a taste of what is still to come.

Pandemic, regulations, darkness and suffering - how different have our lives become! Yet we must never forget that God is with us, filling our lives with love. In Chapter 14 of St. John, Jesus tells his disciples at the Last Supper: 'There are many rooms in my Father's house.' How do you picture that room? What does the Lord do to make it special for you? Who are the people who come your way or are a part of your life whom you can inspire with such a vision? Our long journey continues and we have many questions. The complications of life assail us but the Lord is close to protect and defend us. The light of the Gospel shines out and nothing can take away that light from us. There really IS hope.

In these coming days, I invite you *to walk with the Lord*. Watch the people coming your way. Learn from them. Share with them a smile, a kind word, a note of promised hope. Look around at nature and witness the signs of spring bursting forth. Feel, experience and radiate God's presence!

Let's pray for one another. Fr. Tony and I ask God's blessing upon you. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*

PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF MASS IN WELWYN GARDEN CITY

Friday 7pm Mass at Our Lady's The new strain of coronavirus is a worry and we still want to ensure the safety of all coming to church and of our stewards. Here are some extra changes we have made in our churches:

- 1. Creating greater distance between people in the pews.
- 2. Having more protection for the stewards by their being behind a table as people arrive and as they leave.
- 3. The distribution of Holy Communion will be more measured, with distancing between the 'bubbles' that come up.
- 4. It is even more important for people arriving at the doors of the church to keep extra space between them and those in front and those behind.
- 5. Socialising outside the church before or after Mass should NOT happen for everyone's well-being and safety.
- 6. Church heaters will switch off 5 minutes before Mass begins and more ventilation will be absolutely necessary.

PEACE SUNDAY-17th January 2021

In England and Wales we celebrate Peace Sunday on the third Sunday of January. Resources for parishes, young people and schools are provided by Pax Christi – part of the international Catholic movement for Peace.

The day provides us with an opportunity to build on the global World Day of Peace that is celebrated on New Year's Day each year and is accompanied by a <u>message</u> <u>from Pope Francis</u>.

Pax Christi's National President is the Vice President of the Bishops' Conference, Archbishop Malcolm McMahon of Liverpool.

Promoting the theme, 'A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace', Archbishop McMahon wrote to parishes to encourage them to support the work of Pax Christi and to raise up the Gospel message of peace:

"The Christian message of peace, through reconciliation, justice and nonviolence, can offer hope and direction in these times. I invite you to seriously consider facilitating a collection for, or making a donation to, the work of Pax Christi at this time as a way to make a practical contribution to continuing the work of peace."

POPE'S MESSAGE

Pax Christi has based its Peace Sunday materials on the <u>message from Pope Francis</u> to mark the 54th annual World Day of Peace. In it, Pope Francis highlights Catholic Social Teaching as an expression of Christian care for all people – particularly in the light of the COVID-19 pandemic.

In presenting loving care as a path to peace, the Pope highlights the connection between social injustice and violent conflict, and the critical role of women at all levels of peacebuilding.

He calls on leaders in all sectors – the state, business, science and academics, international organisations, and media – to adopt the principles of Catholic Social Teaching: the dignity and rights of each person, the common good, solidarity, peacebuilding, and the protection of creation.

He explains that these can act "as a 'compass', capable of pointing out a common direction, and ensuring 'a more humane future."

Where there is violence, Pope Francis calls on peacemakers to promote healing and renewed encounter.
