Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time 7th February 2021

It is nearly two years since some of us were able to make the Camino to Santiago de Compostela in the Spanish north-west. We trekked 100km in order to receive the 'passport' and a special certificate. There was solidarity among our group of walkers, some of whom were seasoned marathon runners and others pure novices. I still remember being told afterwards that some of *you* thought that there was no way *I* would make it! There were days when members of the group skipped breakfast in order to get a head-start over others. Sometimes the day's route was short and made us imagine it would be a doddle. We soon were overcome by the power of the hot sun and aching muscles taking over because of a steep climb! The intense joy we all felt at our achievement was memorable: clapping and cheering as we toasted each person arriving in Santiago; there were tears of happiness and such elation. An amazing party rounded off our pilgrimage!

I have been thinking a lot about this experience in recent days as I go for my walks around Welwyn Garden City. Obviously it's not the hot Spanish weather and certainly not such a distance! I have heard the birds singing everywhere! They always seem to create a harmonious sound as they call out from roof tops and any ledge where they can rest. There are red kites soaring to great heights as well as the small blue tits playing in the gardens. Isn't God's Creation marvellous? The trees are preparing the buds to open and hopefully in no time there will be blossom and new life emerging. We have been promised more snow by the weather forecasters and that will present obstacles as well as beauty.

In another month we will reach the first anniversary of the ordeal of lockdown. What a year! This year has certainly challenged us. No week has been easy; challenges,

issues and planning for the future have confronted us. As with the 100km walk, solidarity has been crucial - we are not on our own. The frontline workers, giving of themselves. The resilience of the older generation who have faced other historic crises is admirable. Neighbours keep an eye out for one another. There has been, and still is, enormous generosity. We are all helping one another in this trying period. There has been a huge surge of cases of people's mental health being affected - young and old. Mutual support, patience and listening so important. We will have to keep at it in the weeks and months to come! What a celebration we long for! The building up of dreams and aspirations, the hugs and embraces we so want to give and receive. And yet we soldier on day by day and yearn for a destination safe and secure.

In our Gospel reading today from St. Mark, Jesus is with people in variety of situations and places. He leaves the synagogue, going to Simon Peter's house. There is healing and the presence of a multitude at the door seeking strength and comfort. He finds time to be 'alone' with his Father. The disciples find him, alerting him to the fact that *everyone* is looking for him. Jesus then heads off to other places to carry out his mission bringing a taste of salvation to humanity. Jesus is with *us* everywhere. He makes known Divine Presence whether we are alone or with others. His mission is to us and to others. He is in harmony with his Father and is ready to be with us as we are but calling us towards the wonder of God's Kingdom. It is a long journey with stops and starts, with hills and ravines, with blistering sunshine and icy cold. Let's not be afraid but walk with him. Let us have confidence that he is here with us now, lavishing upon us grace and love.

The new strain of coronavirus is a worry and we still want to ensure the safety of all coming to church and of our stewards. Here are some extra changes we have made in our churches:

- 1. Creating greater distance between people in the pews.
- 2. Having more protection for the stewards by their being behind a table as people arrive and as they leave.
- 3. The distribution of Holy Communion will be more measured, with distancing between the 'bubbles' that come up.
- 4.It is even more important for people arriving at the doors of the church to keep extra space between them and those in front and those behind.
- 5. Socialising outside the church before or after Mass should NOT happen for everyone's well-being and safety.
- 6. Church heaters will switch off 5 minutes before Mass begins and more ventilation will be absolutely necessary.

The Bishops' Conference has advised that ashes can only be given by being sprinkled on the head (and not in the usual way as a Sign of the Cross on the forehead). Consequently, here in Welwyn Garden City the ashes will be given to those who wish to receive them (by one of the priests) after Holy Communion has been distributed by the other priest as people leave the church. There will be a streamed Mass on the YouTube channel available from 7am. Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fasting and Abstinence

Funerals can take place with 30 mourners maximum.

Adults for the Sacraments

Adults who wish to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion or Adults already baptised in a Christian Church who wish to be received into the Catholic Church or Catholic Adults who missed out on Confirmation when younger.

We will do all we can to keep people safe and not be at risk whilst encouraging formation for the Sacraments. At this stage we need to know names and details so we can be in touch.
