Third Sunday of Lent 7th March 2021

In four weeks it'll be Easter! Does that scare you or are you feeling more hopeful that journey's end does not seem too far away? This time last year we were soon to enter into lockdown and our whole way of life about to be changed dramatically and drastically: not being able to visit loved ones, masks and hand-sanitising being the regime with social distancing, holidays and outings put on hold, no public worship for the time being. It also marked the beginning of the streaming of Mass - a whole new experience for me and, perhaps, for many of you too! The fascinating thing about the streamed Mass is the range of comments which I occasionally hear. Recently a parishioner told me she texts her friend during Mass and they compare notes. Someone else informed me that the cooking of lunch is accompanied by Sunday Mass in the background! We have entered into such an extraordinary mode of being both inside the church and in everyday life. Our connections with one another have entered a totally new dimension. Physically we have not necessarily been able to be present to one another; through the internet we have realised there are still so many *out there* who are interested and care.

In our Gospel reading today, Jesus cleanses the Temple. After the Wedding Feast at Cana, he travels to Jerusalem for Passover and does the unthinkable - so much is cleared out! Can you imagine an event like that taking place in our own day? The police would be there in a flash, an arrest made, interviews and assessments...and definitely the Press! At the start of his ministry in St. John's Gospel, the Lord wants things to be done in the right way especially in the Temple, God's house. Clutter and distraction to be removed and the focus shifted to the 'Temple' which is his Body and reference to his being raised up on the third day. The Passover experienced by the People of Israel centuries before

will have a new meaning in the Death and Resurrection of Jesus at Easter. The here and now will break into eternity just as the Son left his place at the Father's Right Hand to enter our reality.

Lent continues. We have more weeks to walk with the Lord. There still are opportunities to be seized: things to be sacrificed, extras to be undertaken. With the Gospel reading in mind, what do you think in your life needs to be cleansed? Are there obstacles getting in the way? Is there light trying to get in? Does your whole being yearn to be kick-started? Jesus knows us very well and can see into our minds and hearts. He is well aware of the pain, suffering and struggles of our lives. He also perceives what is possible and avenues which could be opened up with a little prompting (or a big kick!). This Lent reflect back on the last twelve months and ponder what has been hard, what has been novel and life-giving, what has drawn you even closer to God and an experience of his love. Ask the Lord Jesus to be your companion in whatever you face and to bring you to a fresh outpouring of grace at Easter.

Let's continue to pray for one another. God bless you.

Funerals can take place with 30 mourners maximum.

First Holy Communion (and Confession) - Children should be at least in Year 3

Confirmation - Young people should be at least in Year 9

Adults for the Sacraments

Adults who wish to join the Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion or Adults already baptised in a Christian Church who wish to be received into the Catholic Church or Catholic Adults who missed out on Confirmation when younger.

We are using the Season of Lent to do the preparation and will celebrate the Sacraments soon after Easter. (Dates haven't yet been decided) It is not ideal but this past year has had so many ups and downs with dates due to lockdown and worries about the coronavirus. We do not want to put extra pressure on families or individuals at a time of much uncertainty. We want adults and children to share in the life of the Church through the Sacraments. Most of the preparation will be done at home with families/individuals and we will keep in touch with everyone. We will do all we can to keep people safe and not be at risk whilst encouraging formation for the Sacraments. Thank you for your co-operation.
