OUR LADY,

Were you afraid of the dark when you were a child? I certainly was! I often worried that something sinister was lurking in the darkness, so I insisted that the bedroom door was kept open in order to let in light from the landing. Like so many children, I had a fear of what I couldn't see or understand.

Just like a child who still feels fear, even though he or she has been assured that there are no monsters hiding in the shadows, so our faith and confidence can fail us when we encounter frightening or uncertain realities in our lives. In this way we are not all that different from the frightened disciples in today's Gospel. They had seen Jesus demonstrating his divine power time and again, but when a storm struck the boat they were sailing in they were terrified!

As we reflect on this Gospel passage, however, we can see that fear wasn't the end of the story. In Mark's account, the storm becomes an opportunity to understand Jesus more deeply as the one who brings God's power and action into our lives.

Although the version of this passage we hear at Mass tells us that Jesus 'woke up' after the disciples called out to him, a more specific translation conveys the image of Jesus rising to his full height and power in the stern of the boat. Jesus directly confronts the nearly overwhelming power of the wind and the waves. Mark seems to be invoking Old Testament images of God's power over raging waters, including those in Job and Psalm 107 that we hear in the First Reading and Responsorial Psalm. Mark is telling us that Jesus possesses the same divine power that inspired the faith and hope of the people of Israel for generations.

In a sense, this passage is holding up a mirror for us, inviting us to look at our own lives and to consider how we respond when chaos seems to be breaking out around us. Do we become fearful as we try to hold onto some illusion of control, or do we find hope and confidence in what has been revealed to us about God's power and action?

In <u>The Road to Peace</u>, Henri Nouwen reflected, "Fear is not of God," going on to add that God is "the God of love, a God who invites you to receive — to receive the gifts of joy and peace and gratitude of the poor, and to let go of your fears so that you can start sharing what you are so afraid to let go of."

The invitation for us in this Sunday's liturgy is to view the world around us with the eyes of faith, so that fear may be replaced with wonder and awe at what God has done — and is continuing to do — in our lives and in the world.

Fr Norbert and I continue to pray for you. Please pray for us, too! God bless. Fr Tony.
