

'Who is the greatest?' is a question the disciples found themselves asking many times, thus competing for a position of prominence. Jesus, on the other hand, speaks of service and giving his life as a ransom for many. Those called by the Lord have an instinct that there is something so special and all-pervading about the Master who offered personal invitations to them, yet they fail to grasp that Christ's glory will come through suffering, death and resurrection. They pick and choose; they conveniently forget. Their many mistakes seem to snowball even further!

Just take a few moments today to ponder the enormity of what it means for Jesus to say to each one of us personally that his life was given up as a ransom for each one of us - YES! I matter to him, and he sees a quality of grace which has been lavished upon me by the Holy Spirit. When Jesus carried his Cross, the burden laid upon him included all that falls on me and he eagerly wants me to know that I do not have to struggle on my own. This is the perfection of love shown by God the Father towards humanity created in his image and likeness. What a noble calling!

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION** On the parish website wgc-catholics.org.uk there are forms for parents to download to enrol children and young people for these Sacraments. First Communion children should be at least in Year 3 at school and Confirmation candidates in at least Year 9. Preparation will begin after the February half-term in 2022 with the Sacraments being celebrated next summer. The enrolment forms will help us to know how many are involved and to plan the respective preparation courses.

'The purpose of the synod is not to produce more documents. Rather it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for our common mission.' (Vademecum 1.3)

We are asked to reflect on a series of questions:

During this terrible pandemic, what strengths did I find in my faith and faith community?

How, during this time, was I disappointed and sorrowful?

In what ways did the grace of God most clearly touch and uplift me?

Whom did we neglect the most?

Who feels left out?

What could we do better?

How do we choose priorities for our own mission?

The Pope does not only want us to share our thoughts with others; he wants us to sharpen our skill of listening to the other, thus developing our own understanding. I would ask you to take time this week to think hard about your response to these questions from Cardinal Vincent Nichols. Perhaps you might chat with family, friends or fellow parishioners? Why not jot down some of the fruits of your discussion and send them to Fr. Norbert?

On her journey she will visit Westminster Cathedral on Monday 25th October at 2pm, where she will be welcomed by Cardinal Vincent.
