32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time 7th November 2021

The Gospel that we are given this Sunday is a familiar one. Jesus points to the poor widow who he sees putting two small coins into the temple treasury and he tells the disciples that she has put in more than any of the others. While the wealthier people around her were giving substantial amounts, this was actually money that was surplus to their requirements. The poor widow on the other hand gave all that she had to live on.

It is a reminder to us that God requires everything – the whole of our lives – and not just a percentage of it. The first and the greatest of the commandments is this; 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' It means putting God first in our lives and making him the number one priority; not treating him as an afterthought or something that we consider when we have nothing better to do.

Perhaps a good thing to think about in the light of this Gospel is our participation in the Sunday Mass. Is my attendance at Mass something that is a non-negotiable part of my life, something that defines me as a Catholic, or has it fallen a little in my list of priorities?

The ability for many people to attend Mass over the last year has been severely restricted by the pandemic and the Church has recognised this by suspending the Sunday obligation for a while. However this is a temporary measure; it is envisaged that the obligation to attend Mass will be reinstated on the first Sunday of Advent, depending on the Covid situation.

Our motivation to be at Mass should spring from our love for the Lord. When we cannot receive Christ's body because of sickness or some other serious reason, then we should feel the lack of this very deeply. We should always bear in mind the commandment to keep the Sabbath holy and to receive the Holy Eucharist as regularly as possible.

SYNODAL PATHWAYS The Cardinal has asked us to prepare for the Synod of Bishops in 2023. 'The purpose of the synod is not to produce more documents. Rather it is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore strength to our hands for our common mission.' (Vademecum 1.3)

We are asked to reflect on a series of questions:

During this terrible pandemic, what strengths did I find in my faith and faith community?

How, during this time, was I disappointed and sorrowful?

In what ways did the grace of God most clearly touch and uplift me?

Whom did we neglect the most?

Who feels left out?

What could we do better?

How do we choose priorities for our own mission?

The Pope does not only want us to share our thoughts with others; he wants us to sharpen our skill of listening to the other, thus developing our own understanding. I would ask you to take time this week to think hard about your response to these questions from Cardinal Vincent Nichols. Perhaps you might chat with family, friends or fellow parishioners? Why not jot down some of the fruits of your discussion and send them to Fr. Norbert?
