Fourth Sunday of Advent 19th December 2021

Our Advent journey has almost reached its end! Today the Church presents us with the powerful image of Our Lady on the move. She had received the Angel's message and believed what was said to her. Now she just has to be with her cousin Elizabeth and this involves a long, tiring journey south to Judaea. Mary would have had plenty of time to think about her calling, the impact of what was being asked of her and the path she would have to take. Her heart was filled with joy at the way God had worked in her life and so, upon arriving at Elizabeth's home and greeting the older one, there is an outpouring of the Holy Spirit as the child leaps for joy in Elizabeth's womb. What was Christ's reaction in his Mother's womb? Both women experience the power of God's presence and are inspired with prophetic words. What an encounter!

Maybe you are feeling the fatigue of the long Advent journey with the challenges of Covid and restrictions which have to be implemented? Perhaps some of the traditions you were looking forward to at home, school or work have been curtailed? The Christmas celebration in church still is not 'back to normal'. It is draining having to keep responding and find just the right way. Ponder Our Lady and keep her image before you. She is determined to do the right thing. She is humble of heart. She is the receptacle bearing God's Son within her. Our call is to do right by God and to admit we do not always know everything. Christmas is the reminder that God made his home in our midst and shares our joys and sorrows, our doubts and fears, our hopes and dreams; talk to him and find a moment to hear his response.

Will you be on the move this week? Visiting family or friends? Are you a visitor who has arrived in Welwyn Garden City? Are you still reflecting on what it means to be caught up in a pandemic or wondering when we will be able to say with conviction that it is over? May Christmas be a time of encounter especially with Christ, Emmanuel/God-with-us; he carries burdens for and with us, loving us into life. The Cross is in our midst and the Light of Resurrection shines out even more deeply with radiance!

CHRISTMAS MASSES Please note that there will be morning Mass at St. Bonaventure's on Christmas Eve (Friday) at 9.30.

In terms of the various Masses the following will be the case:

Christmas Eve 5pm, 6pm, 7pm will be the 'Vigil Mass' of Christmas with St. Matthew's account of Christ's Birth (1:18-25)

Christmas Eve 9pm, 10pm, 11pm will be 'Midnight Mass' with St. Luke's account of Christ's Birth (2:1-14)

Christmas Day 9am will be the 'Dawn Mass' with the St. Luke's account of the shepherds going to Bethlehem (2:15-20)

Christmas Day 10am, 11am will be 'Mass during the Day' with St. John's account of the Word who became Flesh (1:1-18)

Carols will be sung at all the Masses.

NEWSLETTER There will be a printed newsletter available on Christmas Day which will take us to, and include, the Baptism of the Lord (8th/9th January). VISITOR Monsignor John Kallarackal who works at the Apostolic Nunciature in Wimbledon has family here in Welwyn Garden City and has asked to join us for some of the Christmas Masses. We are delighted to be able to welcome him to our churches and to offer him our hospitality albeit for a few days. Nowadays whenever a priest comes in this way, a testimonial is required to satisfy Church and Safeguarding guidelines. The Papal Nuncio has given the appropriate documentation and the Vicar General has concurred. We look forward to Fr. John's arrival!

MASS IN WGC The times of weekday and weekend Masses have now returned to the usual schedule in our three churches. Mass intentions can be booked in all three churches. The safety and security of all people is important which means that distancing in the benches and going up to Holy Communion is respected, face coverings are now required in law and the sanitising of hands continues. Please note space is at a premium in St. Bonaventure's because of its size. **FINANCIAL SUPPORT OF OUR PARISHES** Please consider setting up a standing order for the church you attend; this will guarantee income to support all that happens. There are forms for each parish; these can be used even if you are not a tax-payer. Just to be clear: YOU set up the standing order with your bank (right hand part of form) and return the left-hand side to us so that we can claim back GiftAid if tax is paid.

Any day now a contactless payment machine called **DONA** will arrive and be installed in each of our churches. It should be possible to GiftAid your donation. We are so grateful to you for your generosity in giving to our parishes especially in the time of pandemic. Not having to worry about money makes a huge difference to Fr. Norbert as your Parish Priest!!!

You will find our new DIGITAL COLLECTION PLATE, contactless terminal in the church. Just use your contactless debit/credit card or smart phone/ device to make a donation.

Simply choose the amount you wish to donate and hold your card onto the reader.



You can also opt-in for Gift Aid to increase your donation by 25%. If you are a UK taxpayer then donating with Gift Aid means that we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 received.

Contactless donations are simple to administer, secure and convenient.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION On the parish website wgc-catholics.org.uk there are forms for parents to download to enrol children and young people for these Sacraments. First Communion children should be at least in Year 3 at school and Confirmation candidates in at least Year 9. Preparation will begin after the February half-term in 2022 with the Sacraments being celebrated next summer. The enrolment forms will help us to know how many are involved and to plan the respective preparation courses.
