All of us are very different: our circumstances and traditions, the people with whom we share our lives and our ages. What do you think of when you see or hear that word 'CHRISTMAS' ? In the press we have been told that Christmas 2021 has not been 'lost' - what does that mean? Let's take time to reflect on this.

In my family as I grew up, I remember the lovely smells of the kitchen on Christmas Day: the turkey in the oven with my Dad's sausage and chestnut stuffing, the curries and pilau from our Goan heritage, the Christmas sweets with hints of India and Portugal. For us the Crib given by my uncle to Mum and Dad had pride of place in our front room from which passers-by could see it when illuminated. When we left Nairobi in 1968, the Carmelite nuns gave my parents a musical candle holder with angels and the melody of Silent Night. We would always play this and light the candle at Christmas when we would pray the Rosary at the Crib. There was so much to get ready with decorations and tidying up! My parents had grown up with the tradition of new clothes for Christmas and so this was the case for us. My brothers and I would serve at Midnight Mass after which there would be a great catching up with family and friends for quite a while. Only once or twice can I recall snow being on the ground. On Christmas evening our wider family would come round and there'd be snacks and the singing of carols. We'd go to bed exhausted but so happy.

Life can't always be like that. We grow older and sadly loved ones are no longer with us. Some of the time-consuming traditions do not need to be honoured as in the past and fresh approaches break in and become our new norm. Covid has taught us to adapt - even at the last minute. And Covid has revealed to us something new which is possible in celebrating the Birth of Christ.

Over my years as priest, I have been opened up to diverse traditions and I have created new ones too! The constant is Christ who comes to us as we are and whatever we face. The eternal love of God and his compassion on humanity is the thread running through Christmas. The ways we celebrate - new and old - signify that he matters to us and echo how much we are treasured by him. We will NEVER lose Christmas! Jesus Christ is the Saviour born for us and for humanity!

If you are going away, stay safe and come back renewed. If you are a visitor in one of our parishes, we wish you a warm welcome and a happy stay. For the community of our parishes, thank you for your presence, prayers and example. This is Fr. Willliam's first Christmas as priest and in our Garden City. He and I wish you every blessing this Christmas. It is a privilege and a joy to serve you; I feel so fortunate to be in your midst. Happy Christmas with peace, health and hope in 2022! DONA has arrived and has been installed in each of our churches. This is a machine for contactless payments to be made to the particular parish in which the machine is sited. It should be possible to GiftAid your donation. We are so grateful to you for your generosity in giving to our parishes especially in the time of pandemic. Not having to worry about money makes a huge difference to Fr. Norbert as your Parish Priest!!!

VISITOR Monsignor John Kallarackal who works at the Apostolic Nunciature in Wimbledon has family here in Welwyn Garden City and has asked to join us for some of the Christmas Masses. FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION On the parish website wgc-catholics.org.uk there are forms for parents to download to enrol children and young people for these Sacraments. First Communion children should be at least in Year 3 at school and Confirmation candidates in at least Year 9. Preparation will begin after the February half-term in 2022 with the Sacraments being celebrated next summer. The enrolment forms will help us to know how many are involved and to plan the respective preparation courses.
