
# WELWYN GARDEN CITY



We're half-way through Lent - REJOICE! (in Latin Laetare!) This is the Sunday to tone down the purple and move to rose/pink vestments to signal this important staging-post. Moreover, in this country it is Mothering Sunday with the thanksgiving and signs of appreciation expressed and offered. In addition(!) we have now entered British Summer Time; so, after recovering from a lost hour of sleep, we can look forward to more sunshine and longer days. It is all happening!

In our Gospel reading today from St. Luke, we hear about the loss - not of an hour but of a son. Jesus presents his audience with a brilliant story to get their minds pondering the sheer graciousness of God's love and mercy which make up for the pain and hurt we can cause others. The Lord is so aware of the religiously-minded people who resent the time he spends with sinners. For Christ, this is not wasted time but an outpouring of real care and compassion for those who have become distanced through their own fault or through circumstance. The younger of the two sons 'comes to his senses' and determines to return home and express his contrition for his wasteful extravagance. The father is on the constant lookout for his lost son and runs to him when he catches sight of him, lavishing affection, restoring him to his place in the house and celebrating with a magnificent banquet. The older son, as we all know, is consumed with envy and hates the idea of such a feast for the one who has squandered everything. The father again leaves the house in search of his other son, assuring him of his love and constancy. He insists that for such a return, a party beyond compare is necessary because it is as if his younger boy has come back from the dead - he is alive!

This week our children will be making their First Confession. This is always a significant moment in a family's and a community's life. Trying to get over the nerves

and finding the right words to express sorrow for sin is part of the challenge and is only natural. However, I asked the children and their parents at last Sunday's workshop to keep remembering that this Sacrament - as with every Sacrament - is a celebration as words are used to articulate what has been sinful and words are offered back of Absolution, making concrete the forgiveness God offers. Please pray for them that it will be the first of many experiences of God's rich mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. What about you? Why not use today's Gospel as a means of preparing for the Sacrament yourself? Our Service on Tuesday 12th April at 8pm will be a great moment for our community before Easter arrives. Why not come?Be assured of my prayers for you and your loved ones. Let us continue to lift up Ukraine to God in prayer. God bless you. With much love, *Fr. Norbert*
